1.1 SITE VISITS

PART 1 GENERAL

1.1 (AM#1) STATEMENT OF WORK

1. Buildings 11115. Remove two evaporative coolers located outdoors. Remove two exhaust fans located on the roof of the building. Remove abandoned equipment and materials on the mezzanine (shown as a bid option). And remove a portion of the associated distribution ductwork; however, most of the existing distribution ductwork will remain. Provide new condenser water supply and return piping underground from existing Valve Pit No. 3. Provide one new make-up Air handling unit located outdoors; unit will discharge a 100% outside air supply directly into the air plenum above the ceiling. Provide eight new heat pumps, located above the ceiling, to draw return air directly from the return air plenum above the ceiling. Provide new supply ductwork from the heat pumps into the existing ductwork. Also provide a secondary pump and associated hydronic plumbing to each heat pump to circulate a constant volume of condenser water through all new heat pumps and the new make-up Air handling unit. Provide an additional secondary condenser water pump and associated plumbing (shown as a bid option) for each building; this pump will alternate operation with the other pump and will provide redundancy in case of failure. Also provide associated ceiling replacement, steel framing, roof penetrations, and associated electrical work.

2. Buildings 11141 and 11143. Remove four evaporative coolers and four exhaust fans located on the roof of each building. Remove two natural gas-fired furnaces located in the mechanical room of each building. And remove a portion of the associated supply air ductwork and all of the associated return air ductwork. Provide new condenser water supply and return piping underground from existing Valve Pit No. 3. Provide four new heat pumps, located on the roof of each building, to draw in outside air and mix it with return air. Connect the heat pumps into the existing supply ductwork. Provide a secondary pump and associated hydronic plumbing to each heat pump in each building to circulate a constant volume of condenser water through all new heat pumps. Also provide an additional secondary condenser water pump and associated plumbing (shown as a bid option) for each building; this pump will alternate operation with other pump and will provide redundancy in case of failure. Also provide associated ceiling replacement, roof penetrations, and associated electrical work. Provide all work as shown on enclosed plans and specifications.

3. In addition to the requirements specified in Section 00210 PROPOSAL SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS, complete and submit the sample task order project bidding schedule, with subcontractors bid tabulation, with the bidder's proposal.

**Installation of Fort Bliss, El Paso County, Texas**

**1. Service Contract Act (SCA) Wage Determination Number 94-2511, Revision Number 19**, will be applicable to those activities performed under Delivery/Task Order with regard to contract installation support requirements for certain minor maintenance repairs, clerical support services, custodial services, grounds maintenance, and landscaping or upon the issuance of a Delivery/Task Order requiring the utilization of professional/service employees, i.e., Biologists, Agronomists, Environmentalists, Environmental Abatement, Computer Specialists, Architects/Engineers, Surveyors, and associated Technicians thereof of the professional/technical trades. This wage determination will also be used for any Delivery/Task Order issued for demolition activities where no further construction will be performed at the site of the demolition.

**NOTE:** Payroll records are not required to be submitted to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers for work performed under the Service Contract Act (SCA). SCA payroll records are required to be kept by the Prime Contractor, and available for review if requested, for a minimum of three years from the date of contract completion. Labor compliance will be monitored by the U.S. Department of Labor for SCA labor records.

**2. Davis-Bacon Act Wage Decision, TX010009, Building Construction Projects**, will be applicable to the construction, alteration, painting or repair of buildings, installation within buildings, appurtenances to buildings, foundations for buildings, excavation and fill for buildings, and utilities within five feet of buildings for those construction activities performed in El Paso County, Texas.

**3. Davis-Bacon Act Wage Decision, TX010031, Highway Construction Projects**, is applicable to all highway construction activities which are performed in El Paso County Texas.

**4. Davis-Bacon Act Wage Decision, TX010032, Sewer and Water Line Projects,** is applicable to all construction activities performed with regard to Sewer and Water Line Projects not shown in Paragraphs 2 and 3 above performed in El Paso County, Texas.

**5. Davis-Bacon Act Wage Decision, TX010065, Residential Construction Projects,** is applicable to the construction, alteration, painting or repair of residential housing units, installations within residential housing units, appurtenances to residences, foundations for residences, excavation and fill for residences, and utilities within five feet of residences for those construction activities performed in El Paso County Texas.

**6. Davis-Bacon Act Wage Decision, TX010106, Tunnel Construction Projects,** is applicable to all construction activities performed with regard to the Tunnels which are performed in El Paso County Texas.

**7. Davis-Bacon Act Wage Decision, TX010064, Heavy Construction Projects,** is applicable to all heavy (paving and utilities construction) and all other construction requirements not shown in Paragraphs 2 and 3 above which are performed in El Paso County, Texas.

**(1) PAYROLL RECORDS ARE REQUIRED, UNDER THE DAVIS-BACON ACT, TO BE SUBMITTED TO THE U.S. ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS FOR ALL CONSTRUCTION WORK PERFORMED.**

**(2) THE WAGE DECISION/TASK ORDER NUMBER APPLICABLE TO THE WORK PERFORMED IS TO BE SHOWN ON ALL THE CERTIFIED PAYROLL RECORDS SUBMITTED.**

**Applicability of Service Contract Act (SCA) VS Davis-Bacon Act (DBA) Wage Determinations:**

**Some contract work may be characterized as either DBA painting/repairs or SCA maintenance. For example, either the DBA or the SCA could cover replacing broken windows, spot painting, or minor patching of a wall. In those instances where a contract service call or order requires construction trade skills (i.e., Carpenter, Plumber, Painter, etc.) but it is unclear whether the work required is SCA maintenance or DBA painting/repairs, apply the following rules---**

- (1) Individual service calls or orders which will require a total of 32 work hours or more work hours to perform shall be considered to be repair work subject to the DBA.**
- (2) Individual service calls or orders which will require less than 32 work hours to perform shall be considered to be maintenance subject to SCA.**
- (3) Painting work of 200 square feet or more to be performed under an individual service call or order shall be considered to be subject to the DBA regardless of the total work hours required.**
- (4) Any questions the Prime Contractor may have regarding SCA vs. DBA applicability to the payroll records must be addressed to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers District Labor Advisor.**

1.1 SCHEDULE

Commence, prosecute, and complete the work under this contract in accordance with the following schedule and Section 00700 CONTRACT CLAUSES COMMENCEMENT, PROSECUTION AND COMPLETION OF WORK and LIQUIDATED DAMAGES.

1.1.1 Testing of Heating and Air-Conditioning Systems

The times stated for completion of (AM#1) a task order include all required testing specified in appropriate specification sections of heating, air conditioning and ventilation systems including HVAC Commissioning. Exception: boiler combustion efficiency test, boiler full load tests, cooling tower performance tests, and refrigeration equipment full load tests, when specified in the applicable specifications, shall be performed in the appropriate heating/cooling season as determined by the Contracting Officer. See Section 01770 TASK ORDER AND CONTRACT CLOSEOUT, paragraph HVAC Testing.

1.2 TIME EXTENSIONS FOR UNUSUALLY SEVERE WEATHER (OCT 1989)  
 (ER 415-1-15)(52.0001-4038 1/96)

a. This provision specifies the procedure for determination of time extensions for unusually severe weather in accordance with the contract clause entitled "Default: (Fixed Price Construction)." In order for the Contracting Officer to award a time extension under this clause, the following conditions must be satisfied:

(1) The weather experienced at the project site during the contract period must be found to be unusually severe, that is, more severe than the adverse weather anticipated for the project location during any given month.

b. Weather Conditions for White Sands Missile Range, New Mexico

(1) Climate is typical of the southwest desert with a wide temperature range between day and night, often as high as 50 degrees F change in 24 hours. The annual range temperature is from a maximum of 108 degrees F in summer to an extreme low of 0 degrees F in winter. The recorded low was -10 degrees F.

(2) Average annual rainfall varies from about 9.5 inches in the southern part of the reservation to over 10 inches in the northern part. During most years, about 60 percent precipitation occurs in July, August, and September.

(3) The prevailing winds are out of the west. A salient feature of these winds is their gusty nature. Wind velocities have reached a maximum of 107 knots. The higher velocities are experienced adjacent to the mountains, and the lower velocities in the valley regions. These winds, chiefly from the west and southwest, vary from small whirlwinds known as "devil-dusters," to high winds of more than 24-hour duration. The devilduster type of whirlwinds throw sand and gravel with sufficient velocity to cause visible pitting of automobile windows and impingement. The high winds with their gusts have removed windows and roofs from houses and buildings in the Post Area. The sand and dust (most prevalent in the spring), cause rapid deterioration of unprotected equipment and instruments. Damaging high winds have also been recorded in November, December, and March.

c. Upon acknowledgment of the Notice to Proceed (NTP) and continuing throughout the contract, the contractor will record on the daily CQC report, the occurrence of adverse weather and resultant impact to normally scheduled work. Actual adverse weather delay days must prevent work on critical activities for 50 percent or more of the contractor's scheduled work day.

#### 1.5.1.1 Meters and Temporary Connections

The Contractor, at its expense and in a manner satisfactory to the Contracting Officer, shall provide and maintain necessary temporary connections, distribution lines, and meters required to measure the amount of each utility used for the purpose of determining charges. The Contractor shall notify the Contracting Officer, in writing, 5 working days before final electrical connection is desired so that a utilities contract can be established.
